



This document contains important information regarding this philanthropic scholarship and must be read in conjunction with the UWA Stipend and Allowance Scholarship Conditions. Scholarship recipients are expected to understand and comply with the requirements outlined in both documents.

Alexander Juett Fellowship - PhD Top-up Scholarship in Agriculture

This scholarship was established by Mrs. Ida Juett in memory of her late husband, Mr. Alexander Juett. It aims to support PhD candidates in gaining international research experience and to further explore Mr. Juett's vision—that human health can be significantly improved by enhancing the nature and quality of food produced for human consumption.

1. Purpose

This scholarship is intended to encourage and support PhD candidates undertaking agricultural research focused on improving the quality of food. Research may explore methods of enhancing soil fertility, plant nutrition, animal nutrition, or any combination thereof, with the ultimate goal of advancing farming practices and outcomes in Western Australia.

2. Details

Support type: supplementary stipend scholarship with research travel award
Value: \$15,000 per annum (stipend), \$5,000 total (research travel award)
Tenure: duration of primary award

3. Eligibility

Citizenship: domestic
Degree: Doctor of Philosophy (00810)
Attendance: full-time (or part-time if approved)
Enrolment: commencing

4. Specific eligibility requirement

- This scholarship will be awarded through a competitive selection process to the highest ranked eligible applicant—who is not already in receipt of a similar award—based on academic merit.
- A supplementary stipend scholarship recipient must hold a RTP or equivalent primary stipend.
- Applicants must demonstrate their intended research is within the purpose of the scholarship.
- Applicant must be a UWA science graduate.
- Preference may be given to a student enrolling in the School of Agriculture & Environment.

5. Application process

Applicants must apply as outlined on relevant UWA websites by the advertised closing date.

An application must include a statement outlining the relevance of the proposed research with evidence of support by the proposed academic supervisor.

6. Awarding and administering office

This scholarship is awarded and administered by the HDR Scholarships Committee on the recommendation of the School of Agriculture and Environment.

The number of scholarships and type of support offered will be determined by the availability of funds and the strategic priorities of the University.



7. Recipient's obligation

The recipient of this scholarships is obliged to:

- (i) apply themselves diligently and to the best of their ability to successfully complete their degree.
- (ii) acknowledge the support of this scholarship in any publication, presentation or thesis resulting from research funded by this scholarship. This should include a statements such as:

"This research was carried out while the author was in receipt of the Alexander Juettt Fellowship - PhD Top-up Scholarship in Agriculture at The University of Western Australia".
