

This document contains important information regarding this philanthropic scholarship and must be read in conjunction with the UWA Stipend and Allowance Scholarship Conditions. Scholarship recipients are expected to understand and comply with the requirements outlined in both documents.

The Elizabeth Clark PhD Scholarship

The late Mr John Clark, a farmer in the Denmark region, bequeathed to The University of Western Australia a portion of his estate to establish and maintain PhD scholarships for research into the fruit and dairying industries.

1. Purpose

This scholarship is available to encourage and assist PhD candidates to conduct research into the: (i) fruit, or (ii) dairying industries, for the benefit of farming in Western Australia.

2. Details

Support type:	supplementary stipend scholarship
Value:	\$10,000 per annum (stipend)
Tenure:	duration of primary award

3. Eligibility

Citizenship	domestic
Degree:	Doctor of Philosophy (00810)
Attendance:	full-time (or part-time if approved)
Enrolment:	commencing

4. Specific eligibility requirement

- This scholarship will be awarded through a competitive selection process to the highest ranked eligible applicant—who is not already in receipt of a similar award—based on academic merit.
- A supplementary stipend scholarship recipient must hold a RTP or equivalent primary stipend.
- Applicants must demonstrate their intended research is in the (i) fruit, or (ii) dairying industries of WA.
- Preference may be given to a student enrolling in the School of Agriculture & Environment.

5. Application process

Applicants must apply as outlined on relevant UWA websites by the advertised closing date.

An application must include a statement outlining the relevant of the proposed research with evidence of support by the proposed academic supervisor.

6. Awarding and administering office

This scholarship is awarded and administered by the HDR Scholarships Committee on the recommendation of the School of Agriculture and Environment.

The number of scholarships and type of support offered will be determined by the availability of funds and the strategic priorities of the University.



7. Recipient's obligation

The recipient of this scholarships is obliged to:

- (i) apply themselves diligently and to the best of their ability to successfully complete their degree.
- (ii) acknowledge the support of this scholarship in any publication, presentation or thesis resulting from research funded by this scholarship. This should include a statements such as:

"This research was carried out while the author was in receipt of The Elizabeth Clark PhD Scholarship at The University of Western Australia".
