

This document contains important information regarding this philanthropic scholarship and must be read in conjunction with the UWA Stipend and Allowance Scholarship Conditions. Scholarship recipients are expected to understand and comply with the requirements outlined in both documents.

Robert & Maude Gledden Postgraduate Research Scholarship

In 1927, Mr Robert John Gledden—renowned surveyor, mining registrar, and warden—bequeathed his estate to The University of Western Australia to support the advancement of education and applied science through scholarships. Mr Gledden played a significant role in the early development of Western Australia's mining sector, contributing to the foundational surveys of the Town of Kalgoorlie and undertaking mining surveys in Coolgardie. His generous bequest continues to support research and innovation in fields aligned with his pioneering work.

1. Purpose

This scholarship is provided to encourage and assist domestic candidates to enrol in and complete a Higher Degree by Research (HDR) with a research focus in applied science, more particularly relating to surveying, engineering, mining or cognate subjects.

2. Details

Support type:	full stipend scholarship with a research & travel award
Value:	\$45,000 per annum (stipend), \$5,000 total (research & travel award)
Tenure:	up to three years and six months

3. Eligibility

Citizenship:	domestic applicants only
Degree types:	Doctor of Philosophy (00810)
Attendance type:	full-time or part-time
Enrolment type:	commencing

4. Specific eligibility requirement

Applicants must demonstrate a clear intent to undertake research in an applied science, more particularly relating to surveying, engineering, mining or cognate subjects.

This scholarship will be awarded through a competitive selection process to the highest ranked eligible applicant—who is not already in receipt of a similar award—based on academic merit.

5. Application process

Applicants must apply as outlined on relevant UWA websites by the advertised closing date.

An application must include a statement outlining the relevant of the proposed research to applied science, more particularly surveying, engineering, mining or cognate subjects with evidence of support by the proposed academic supervisor.

6. Awarding and administering body

This scholarship is awarded and administered by the HDR Scholarships Committee on the recommendation of the School of Engineering.

The number of scholarships and type of support offered will be determined by the availability of funds and the strategic priorities of the University.



7. Supplementary information

This scholarship may from time to time be offered as a completion or top-up scholarship.

8. Recipient's obligation

The recipient of this scholarship is obliged to:

- (i) apply themselves diligently and to the best of their ability to successfully complete their degree.
- (ii) acknowledge the support of this scholarship in any publication, presentation, or thesis resulting from research funded by the scholarship. This should include a statement such as:

"This research was carried out while the author was in receipt of a Robert & Maude Gledden HDR Scholarship at The University of Western Australia."
