



This document contains important information regarding this philanthropic scholarship and must be read in conjunction with the UWA Stipend and Allowance Scholarship Conditions. Scholarship recipients are expected to understand and comply with the requirements outlined in both documents.

Frank Pyke Memorial HDR Scholarship in Sport Science

Janet and Don Pyke, along with family and friends, donated funds to The University of Western Australia to establish a scholarship in memory of the late Professor Frank Pyke and to honour the contribution he made to UWA and to sport science in Australia.

1. Purpose

This scholarship is provided to assist a student, who demonstrates academic excellence and other outstanding achievements, abilities, leadership or community involvement in sport or exercise related activities.

2. Details

Support type: bursary, single payment
Value: \$5,000

3. Eligibility

Citizenship: domestic applicants only
Degree types: Doctor of Philosophy (00810)
Enrolment type: currently enrolled, all disciplines

4. Specific eligibility requirement

- a. The scholarship will be awarded through a competitive selection process to a candidature - who is not already in receipt of a similar award.
- b. Confirmation of Candidature must be achieved by the advertised closing date.
- c. Preference may be given to a candidate enrolled in the School of Human Sciences.
- d. Preference will be given to applicants who demonstrate and verify selection and representation in a recognised sport during the past three years in one or more of the following levels as a player, coach, umpire or administrator:
 - (i) international - selected to represent Australia in competition against other nations in recognised sports
 - (ii) national - selected to represent their state in competition against other Australian states (or from other nations) in recognised sports, including open and youth teams playing in national leagues.
 - (iii) state - selected to compete at the highest level in state-based competitions in recognised sports
 - (iv) local - selected to represent a team or club competing in district and regional competitions in recognised sports.

5. Application process

Applicants must apply as outlined on the relevant UWA website by the advertised closing date, and include:

- (i) evidence of meeting the purpose of the scholarship as detailed in point 1.;
- (ii) a statement outlining involvement and time commitments in roles detailed in point 4.c.; and
- (iii) a short statement outlining the research topic and statement of impact of the bursary.

6. Awarding and administering office

This scholarship is awarded and administered by the HDR Scholarship Committee, based on the recommendation of the School of Human Sciences.

7. Recipient's obligation

The recipient is obliged to:

- (i) apply themselves diligently and to the best of their ability to successfully complete the degree.
- (ii) acknowledge the support of this scholarship in any publication, presentation, or thesis resulting from research funded by the scholarship. This should include a statement such as:

"This research was carried out while the author was in receipt of a Frank Pyke Memorial HDR Scholarship in Sport Science at The University of Western Australia."
