



This document contains important information regarding this philanthropic scholarship and must be read in conjunction with the UWA Stipend and Allowance Scholarship Conditions. Scholarship recipients are expected to understand and comply with the requirements outlined in both documents.

Judith Arnold PhD Scholarship

Ms Judith Arnold left a bequest to UWA towards research in providing improved outcomes in Interstitial Lung Diseases.

1. Purpose

This scholarship is provided to encourage and enable eligible domestic candidates to undertake a PhD with a research focus to provide improved outcomes in interstitial lung disease.

2. Details

Support type:	full stipend scholarship plus a research/travel award
Value:	\$38,110 pa (2026) + 3% annual indexation \$5,000 total (research & travel award)
Tenure:	up to three years and six months

3. Eligibility

Citizenship:	domestic
Degree:	Doctor of Philosophy (00810)
Attendance:	full-time or part-time
Enrolment:	commencing or currently enrolled students

4. Specific eligibility requirement

Applicants must:

- demonstrate a clear intent to undertake research into interstitial lung disease.
- include evidence of support for the research topic by the proposed academic supervisor.

5. General eligibility requirement

Applicants must:

- hold UWA First Class Honours or an award that has been deemed comparable.
- not have previously completed an equivalent or higher-level degree.

The scholarship will be awarded through a competitive selection process to the highest ranked eligible applicant—who is not already in receipt of a similar award—based on academic merit. Preference for this scholarship allocation may be given to commencing student.

6. Application process

Applicants must:

- apply as outlined on relevant UWA website by the advertised closing date.
- outline the relevance of the proposed research.
- submit any requested additional supporting information.

7. Awarding process and administering office

This scholarship is awarded:

- via a competitive academic merit-based selection process to the highest ranked eligible applicant.
- to an applicant not already in receipt of a similar award.
- by the HDR Scholarship Committee on the recommendation of the relevant school.



The value and number of scholarships available is determined by HDRSC having regard to available funds.

8. Recipient's obligation

The recipient of this scholarship is obliged to:

- (i) apply themselves diligently and to the best of their ability to successfully complete their degree.
- (ii) acknowledge the support of this scholarship in any publication, presentation, or thesis resulting from research funded by the scholarship. This should include a statement such as:

"This research was carried out while the author was in receipt of a Judith Arnold PhD Scholarship at The University of Western Australia."
